The purpose for church growth is to share the love of God in Jesus Christ and to add partners in Christian ministry. Our growth ultimately is about reflecting the light that came into the world of Christmas. Growth for the church is focused on illuminating the world around us. Growth for the church expands the love of God in the world in which we live.

We also celebrate the growth and vitality of the church as it has weathered this very difficult storm and has come out on the other side stronger. We ask your help in keeping strong and helping us move forward. We also ask your help in bringing God joy as our church continues to grow in the months and years to come. PRIMO Teacher Spotlight: Janine Jones



Janine Jones received her Bachelor of Science in Music Education from Nazareth College in Rochester, New York, and has a Master's degree in Educational Leadership from Florida Atlantic University. She completed her Orff-Schulwerk teaching certifications at the Master's level at Memphis State University. Janine is a member of the National Association for Music Education, the Florida Music Educators Association, and the American Orff-Schulwerk Association. She has been teaching elementary music at Osceola Magnet School for over 20 years where she has been named Teacher of the Year. Because of Janine's hard work, Osceola Magnet School is designated a Florida Music Demonstration School. Her ensembles have twice been featured at the Florida Music Educator's Association professional development conference. She has had numerous students participate in all-state ensembles on flute and voice, and she has also been an All-State Orff

and Choir Adjudiator. She is a National Board Certified Teacher and is currently teaching Virtual and Transitional for SDIRC, teaching music virtually to over 1200 elementary students online during the pandemic. A woman of many hats, Janine also offers her talents with her background in Educational Leadership by taking leadership roles at the school and district level. She serves the Indian River County School District as Coordinator for Elementary Music, and at Osceola Magnet she's the Chair of the School Advisory Council, Magnet School Coordinator, Grade Level Chair, and has helped Osceola Magnet earn a High Impact Grant from the Education Foundation for an Engineering "Fab Lab". On top of all her other responsibilities, she still mentors new teachers in both music and other subject areas! Janine also directs the Children's Choirs here at First Presbyterian Church and has had her own private flute studio for over 25 years.

I have to admit that when Dr. Bertie asked me to put Janine in the PRIMO teacher spotlight this month, I got really excited to have a chance to write about someone who has been a dear friend of mine for the last 16 years. You see, when I was getting my Bachelor's in Music Education in 2004, I was Janine's very first intern! That particular internship was unique as it was "the year of the Hurricanes" in Vero Beach. My 6-week internship with Janine was paused -TWICE!- by the storms, and out of the 6 weeks, I missed nearly 4 due to

school closures and power outages. Twice, Janine and I moved her classroom onto the elevated stage area so her equipment wouldn't be ruined when the room inevitably flooded. (This was back when Osceola Magnet was located on the corner of Rte. 60 and 6th Avenue, and the whole campus would flood terribly with each storm!) Janine worked hard to make sure I learned everything I needed and passed my requirements so I could still graduate on time in December. If there's one thing I learned during my internship, it was how to think on my feet in the face of adversity! I am beyond blessed and honored to have been paired up with this amazing lady, and she was the reason I ultimately decided to become an Elementary Music Educator as my chosen career. I'm so proud to call her my friend!


